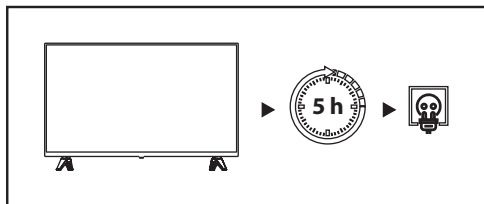

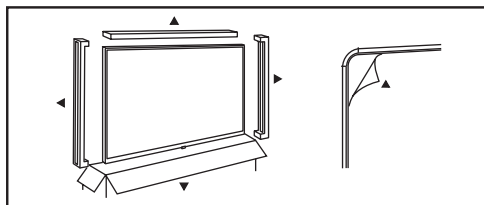

Quick Start Guide

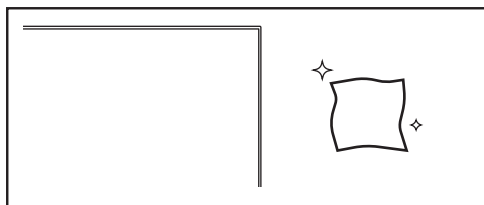


Let the TV stay indoors for at least 5 hours after transportation to avoid damage due to temperature changes.



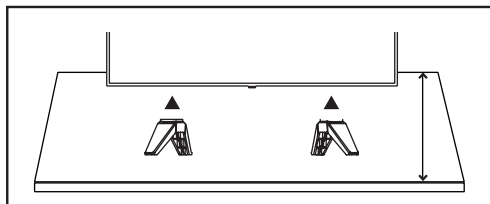
Remove the packaging (cardboard, foam, plastic bags, protective film from the TV body) and gently wipe the TV body with a dry, soft cloth to remove dust.

CAUTION: Do not remove the protective film from the screen panel until installation on the wall or stand is completed, if such film is present.



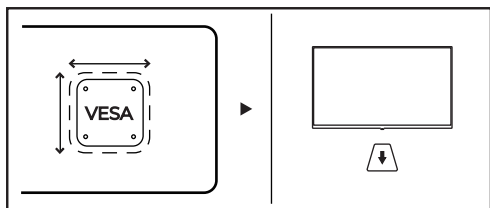
For cleaning the screen, use only a dry, soft, lint-free cloth.

CAUTION: Do not use liquids, sprays, or abrasive materials.



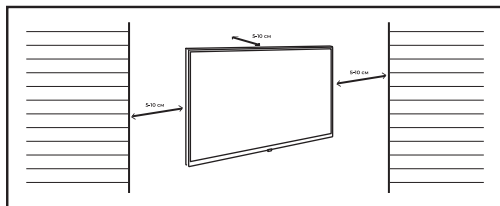
Stand Installation

Install the legs (or stand) from the kit according to the instructions. Use a screwdriver for secure fastening. Place the TV on a flat, stable, hard surface capable of supporting its weight. Ensure that the stand does not extend beyond the edge of the surface.

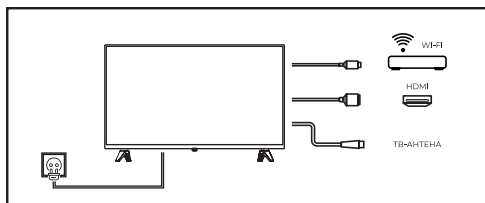


Wall Mounting

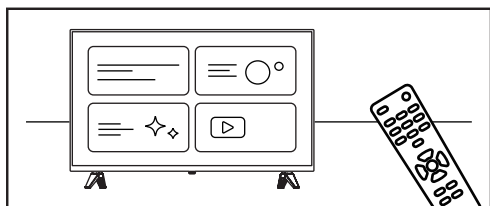
Use only a compatible VESA mount that matches the weight and size of your TV. Before installing the bracket, ensure that the wall can support the TV's weight.



Regardless of the installation method, leave at least 5–10 cm of free space behind and on the sides of the TV for air circulation and cooling. Do not install the TV in closed niches without ventilation, near heat sources (radiators, fireplaces), or in direct sunlight.



Before connecting, ensure that the power supply parameters match the TV's power specifications. Connect the power cord and, if necessary, the antenna, HDMI devices (set-top box, console), or Wi-Fi adapter.



Turn on the TV using the remote control. Perform the initial setup following the on-screen instructions: select the language, connect to Wi-Fi, scan for channels (for the antenna), and log into your account.

- The lightning flash with arrowhead symbol within a triangle alerts the user to the presence of dangerous voltage inside the device that may be sufficient to constitute a risk of electric shock. Do not remove the cover marked with this symbol.

- Before cleaning, disconnect the device from the electrical outlet. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaning agents. Use a dry, soft cloth for cleaning.
- This device is intended for home and personal use only. Do not use this device for commercial, industrial, or other purposes.
- Do not subject the device to strong impacts, excessive temperatures, or prolonged direct sunlight.
- Keep the device away from magnetic objects, motors, and transformers.
- Do not use the device outdoors, regardless of weather conditions.

CAUTION

Never install the TV in an unstable location. The device may fall, causing serious injury or even death. Many injuries, especially to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions, such as:

- Use furniture or stands recommended by the TV manufacturer.
- Use only furniture that is sturdy enough to safely support the weight of the TV.
- Ensure that the device does not extend beyond the edge of the furniture on which it is installed.
- Never place the device on tall furniture (e.g., cabinets or bookshelves) without securely anchoring both the furniture and the device to a suitable support (e.g., a wall).

Operating Conditions

- Ambient temperature: 10 °C to 35 °C.
- Relative humidity: Up to 80 % (at 25 °C).
- Atmospheric pressure: 86 to 106 kPa (650 to 800 mmHg).
- After transportation or storage at low temperatures, allow the TV to acclimatize to room temperature for at least 5 hours before connecting it to the power supply and turning it on.

CAUTION

- To avoid damage or injury, securely mount the device to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions provided in this manual.
- When mounting on angled surfaces, the TV panel must always be installed in a vertical position. The tilt angle between the panel and the vertical plane must not exceed 15° (this rule strictly applies to the bezel-less TV series).

Notes

- The TV is supplied with batteries for the remote control.
- The batteries' service life is indicated on their individual packaging.
- It is recommended to replace the batteries when remote control performance declines or once their service life has expired.

TV Installation

Before using the device, you must attach the stand or mount the device on the wall.

CAUTION

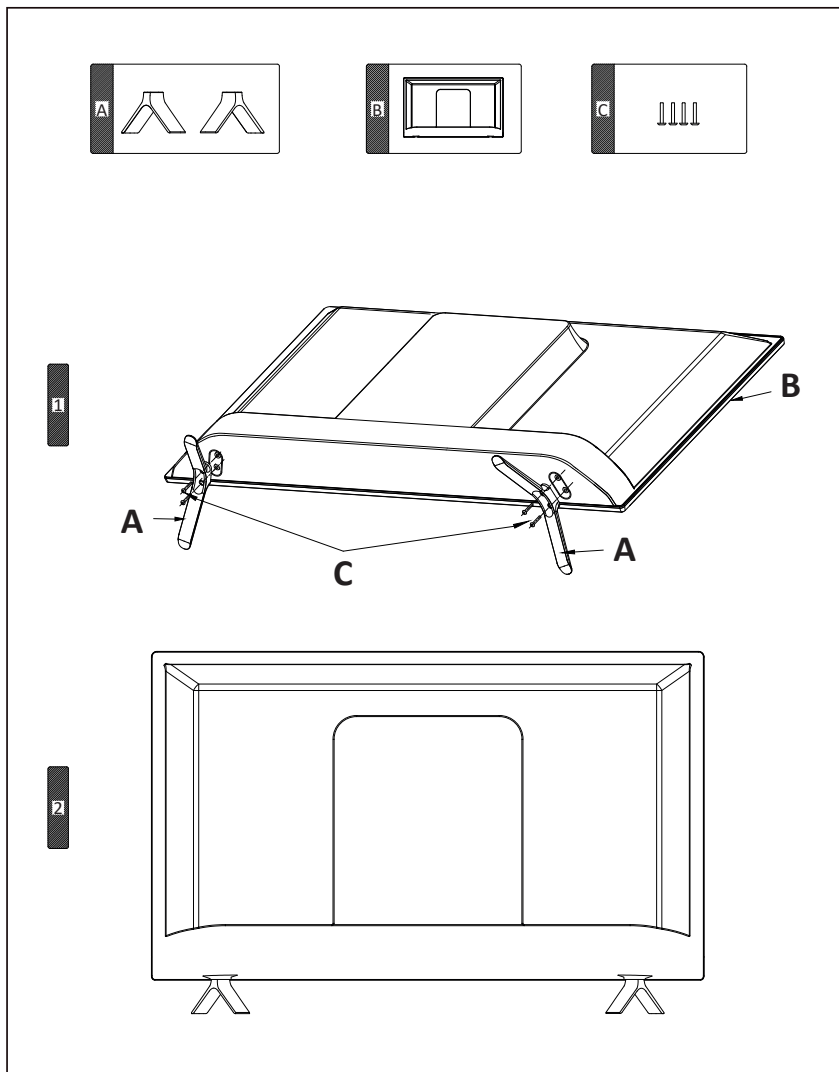
If the TV is not installed on a flat, stable surface, it may be potentially hazardous due to the risk of falling. To avoid damage, you should follow these safety precautions:

- Place the TV only on flat, stable surfaces.
- Ensure that the TV does not overhang the edge of the furniture on which it is installed.
- Do not place the TV on tall furniture unless it is securely fixed.
- Do not place the TV on cloth or other objects located between the furniture and the TV.
- Do not install the TV in locations subject to mechanical vibration.
- Do not install the TV in locations where insects may enter its housing.
- Do not install the TV directly in front of an air conditioner, as condensation may form on the inner screen panel and cause malfunction.
- Do not install the TV in areas with strong magnetic fields, as they may cause interference, and electromagnetic waves could lead to device failure.
- Explain to children the danger of attempting to climb on the furniture where the TV is installed.

Ventilation

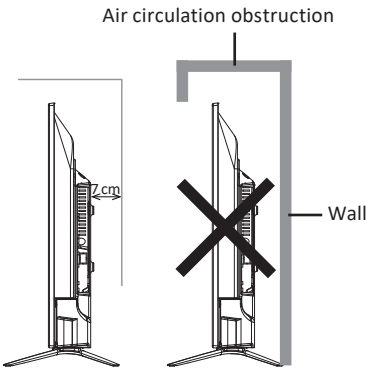
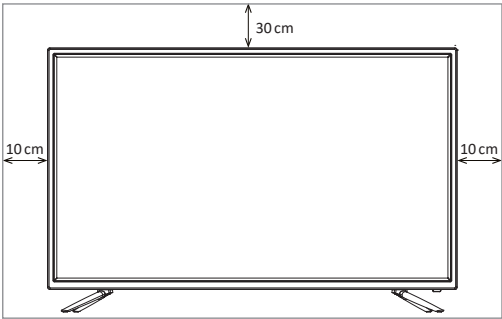
- Ensure that the necessary clearance is left on all sides of the TV, as shown in the diagrams below.
- Do not block the ventilation openings or insert any objects into the housing.
- Do not place the device in a confined space, such as a built-in cabinet. This will prevent proper ventilation and may lead to TV failure.

Stand Assembly

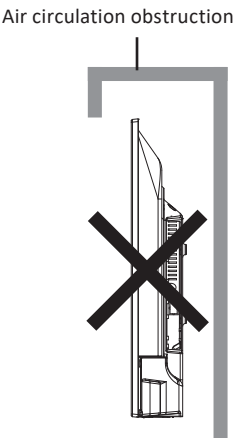
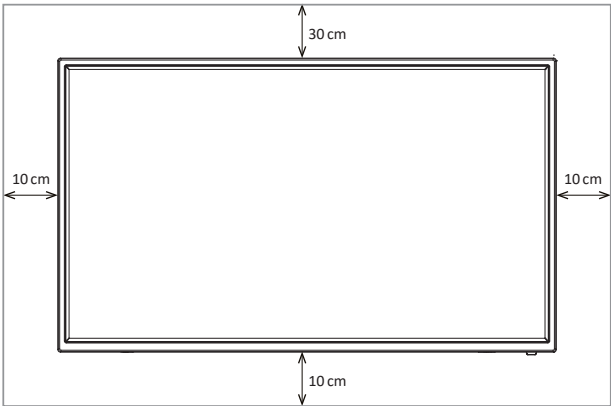


1. Before attaching/removing the stand, make sure the TV is turned off.
2. Place the TV screen-down on a soft surface to prevent damage.
3. Remove the stand legs from the packaging and insert them into the slots on the bottom of the TV.
4. Secure the stand legs using the 4 included screws.
5. To detach the stand legs from the TV, repeat steps 3 and 4 in reverse order.

Clearance for Stand Mounting

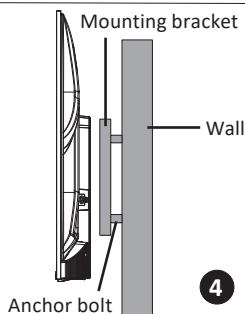
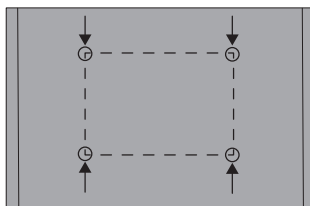
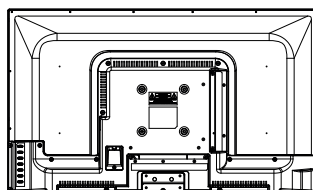
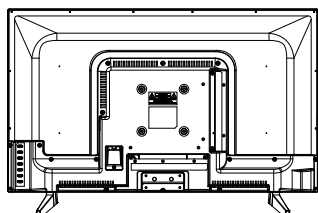


Clearance for Wall Mounting



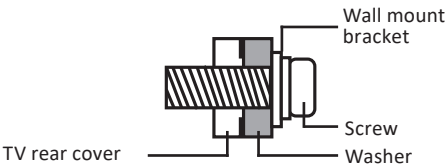
Wall Mounting (Optional)

The TV can be mounted on a wall using a special wall mount bracket (not included in the package). Before wall-mounting the TV, you must remove the manufacturer's stands, as well as disconnect all cables and connectors.



1. Place the TV screen-down on a soft, flat surface to prevent damage.
2. Using a screwdriver, unscrew and remove the manufacturer's stands from the bottom of the TV (1).
3. Mark the distance between the screw holes with a pencil according to the bracket dimensions (2, 3).
4. Drill holes in the wall and insert 4 anchor bolts for mounting.
5. Attach the bracket to the rear of the TV using the screws, then hang the assembly on the wall.

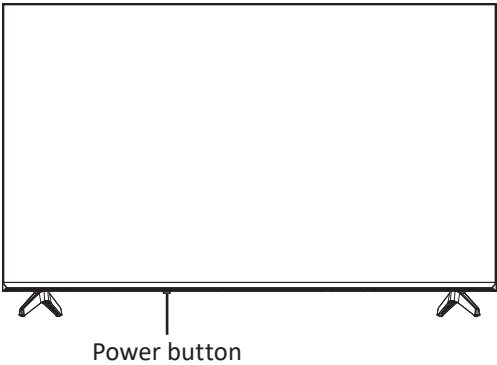

Front Panel

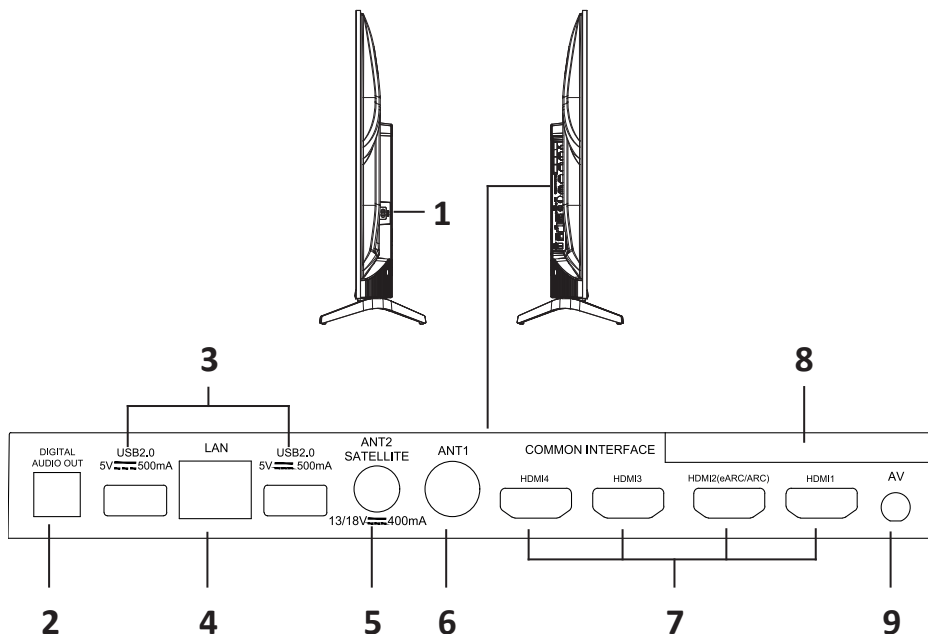


1. Press the power button to turn on the TV.
2. Press and hold the power button to turn off the TV.

Notes

- All images below are for reference only. The position of the power button may vary depending on the model.
- When the TV is powered on, it takes a few seconds to boot up the program. Do not turn off the TV immediately, as this may cause malfunctions.

Side Panels



1. Power cord connector.
2. DIGITAL AUDIO OUT port.
3. USB 2.0 port.
4. LAN port.
5. Satellite antenna connector.
6. Antenna connector.
7. HDMI inputs, high-definition signal interface (HDMI2 supports eARC/ARC).
8. CI card slot.
9. Mini AV cable connector.

Notes

- Check the position and type of each connector before making any connection. A loose connection may cause picture or color issues. Make sure all connections are secure and properly seated. Not all audio and video equipment can be connected to the TV. Please refer to your device's manual for compatibility and connection information.
- Before connecting external equipment, unplug the power cord from the outlet to avoid electric shock.

Note: The actual appearance of the rear panel may differ from that shown in this manual.

Connecting Devices

Connecting the Antenna Cable

You can connect an external antenna using the corresponding connector.

1. Use the ANT2 connector to connect a satellite antenna.
2. Use the ANT1 connector to connect a standard antenna.
3. After connecting, press the «» button on the remote and select **Antenna** or **Satellite**, depending on which cable is connected.

HDMI

Connect an HDMI cable to the ARC (Audio Return Channel) port on the TV and on the audio system (receiver, soundbar).

Used for transmitting high-quality audio and video, as well as controlling the audio device from the TV.

HDMI connectors vary in resolution, refresh rate, and supported features:

- eARC — outputs audio to the connected device via HDMI.
- CEC — allows the TV and connected device to be controlled with a single remote.

Optical Audio Cable (TOSLINK)

Connect the optical cable to the TV and the audio system (home theater, soundbar). Transmits digital audio (Dolby Digital, DTS), but does not support newer formats such as Dolby Atmos.

Coaxial Cable

Used for receiving terrestrial or cable TV broadcasts (analog or digital DVB-T2).

Connect the antenna cable to the TV's ANT1 connector.

USB

Used for playing media files or connecting peripherals (flash drives, external hard drives, or USB adapters such as Wi-Fi or Bluetooth dongles).

Mini AV

A compact version of an analog audio/video connector for connecting older devices such as DVD players, game consoles, or camcorders.

Bluetooth

You can connect various devices to the TV, such as headphones, speakers, a mouse, a keyboard, a gamepad, etc.

- If the device you are connecting has a USB transmitter (such as a keyboard or mouse), first plug the transmitter into the TV's USB port, then proceed with pairing the devices.
- If the device does not have a USB transmitter, put it into pairing mode (refer to the device's user manual for instructions on how to do this) and go to **Settings → Remotes & Accessories → Add Device**.

LAN (Ethernet) or Wi-Fi

Connect the TV to your router via cable or Wi-Fi to enable Smart TV functionality. Provides internet access, streaming services (Netflix, YouTube), and software updates.

DLNA

You can securely share media content between different devices on your home network. The DLNA standard allows the TV to play video, audio, and photo content stored on other devices on the network.

- First, set up the local network on the device you want to stream content from (refer to that device's user manual for instructions on how to do this).
- To view this content on the TV, you will need to use a third-party media player that supports streaming.

CI Card

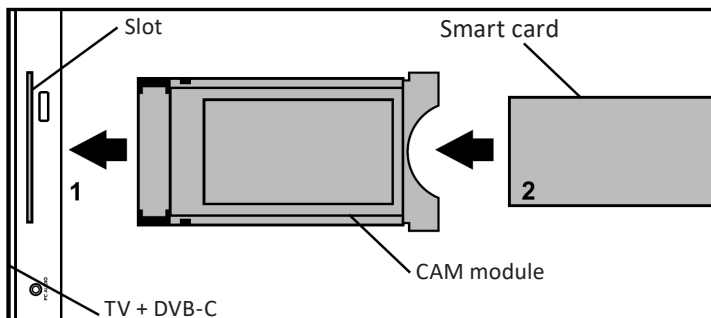
If you use pay TV with encrypted channels, insert the CI card provided by your service provider into this slot. For more information, refer to the documentation supplied with your CI card.

CAUTION

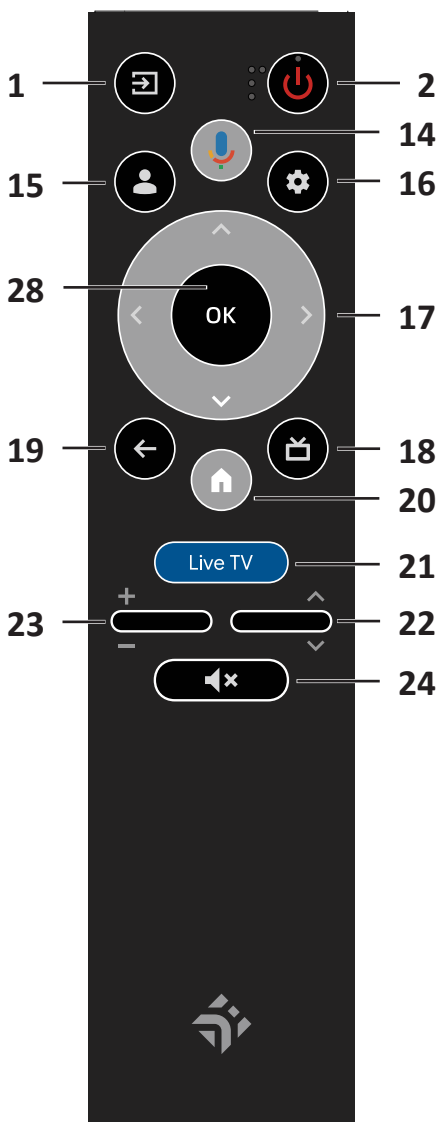
- Always turn off the TV before inserting or removing the CI card. Otherwise, the TV or CI module may be damaged.
- Insert the CI or CI+ module into the slot, making sure it is oriented correctly.
- Before inserting or removing the CAM module, make sure the TV is turned off. Then insert the CI+ card into the CAM module according to the service provider's instructions. CI+ is not supported in some countries and regions; consult your service provider.

Removing the CI Card

- To remove the module, carefully pull it out of the slot.
- After the TV is turned on, the CI/CI+ module will initialize. This may take some time. Once initialization is complete, encrypted channels will become available. If this does not happen, contact your service provider to confirm that encrypted channels are available to you.



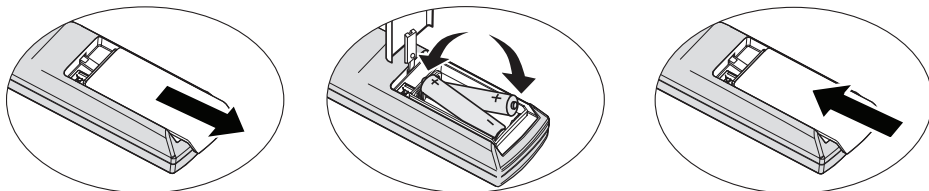

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

1. Turn the remote control over and, while pressing lightly, slide the battery cover in the direction shown by the arrow in the image below.
2. Insert the batteries into the remote control. Make sure the polarity matches the diagram inside the battery compartment.
3. Close the battery cover by sliding it in the opposite direction.



CAUTION: If you do not plan to use the device for an extended period, remove the batteries from the remote control. Otherwise, the remote may be damaged by leaking batteries.

Turning On the TV

1. Connect the power cord to the TV first, then to the power source.
CAUTION: The TV must only be connected to an AC power source. Never connect the device to a DC power source. If the power cord is damaged, under no circumstances connect it to the power outlet, as this poses a risk of electric shock.
2. Connect an external antenna to the ANT1/ANT2 connector on the side panel of the TV. The antenna connector (75 Ω — VHF/UHF/cable) can be used to connect an external antenna or other equipment.
 - If you want to receive a signal from a cable line or cable box, connect the coaxial cable to the ANT1 connector on the side panel of the TV.
 - If you want to receive a signal from your satellite receiver, connect the coaxial cable to the ANT2 connector on the side panel of the TV.
3. When the TV is connected to a power source, it will either turn on immediately or automatically enter standby mode.
4. If the power indicator is lit, the TV is in standby mode. Press the «  » button on the remote control or on the TV itself to turn it on.

Initial Setup

The first time you turn on the TV, a «Welcome» wizard will appear to guide you through the initial setup process. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the setup, such as selecting a language, pairing your remote, connecting to a network, etc. At each step, either make a selection or skip it. If you skip a step, you can complete that setting later from the settings menu.

Notes

- It is recommended to select Set up Google TV and complete its setup to access additional features during initial setup. If you have completed the basic TV setup, you can enter Google TV setup again by pressing «  » on the remote control, then selecting **Settings** → **Set up Google TV** and pressing « **OK** » to confirm.
- When pairing the remote control, keep it within 1 meter of the TV and follow the on-screen pairing instructions. Once remote pairing is complete, you can use the **Google Assistant** button. If you skip remote pairing, you will be prompted to pair the remote with the TV again the first time you press the **Google Assistant** button.

Connecting the Remote Control

The first time it starts up, the TV will immediately prompt you to connect the remote.

1. Press and hold the «  » button and tilt the volume rocker to the «  » position.
2. The indicator on the remote control will start flashing, indicating that the remote is in pairing mode.
3. Once the indicator turns off, the remote is ready to use.

CAUTION: The remote control must be connected via Bluetooth for the voice assistant to work.

«Find My Remote» Function

This function is designed to make it easier to locate the remote control.

CAUTION! This function will only work once the remote control has been paired with the TV and subsequently configured. The distance between the remote control and the TV must not exceed 10 meters.

Turning the Function On/Off

1. Press the «» button.
2. Select **Help** → **Find My Remote** → **Off/On**.

Operation

1. Unplug the power cord and plug it back into the outlet.
2. Press the power button to turn on the TV.
CAUTION! Do not turn off the TV or interact with it in any way.
3. Within 20 minutes, a message will appear on the TV screen indicating that the «Find My Remote» function has started. The remote control will vibrate to indicate its location.

Note: When this function is enabled, the remote control consumes more battery power.

Using the TV

Inputs

Press «» on the remote control to display the list of signal sources. Use the navigation buttons to select an option, then press «**OK**» to enter the submenu. You can also press «» on the remote control to display the main Inputs menu, then press «**OK**» to enter it. Then use the navigation buttons to select the input source and press «**OK**» to confirm.

Volume Control

Adjusting volume: Tilt the rocker to the «**+**» / «**—**» position on the remote control to increase or decrease the volume.

Muting: Press the «» button to temporarily mute the sound. Press the same button again, or move the rocker to the «**+**» position, to unmute.

Automatic Channel Scan

1. In TV mode, press «» the remote control, select **Settings** → **Channels & Inputs** → **Channels**, and select the TV signal source (cable, antenna, or satellite).
2. Select **Channel Scan** and press «**OK**» to start scanning. The TV will automatically scan for available channels based on your country or region.

Note: If only analog channels are found during the scan, this may be due to a weak TV signal.

Common Interface

Encrypted digital TV channels can be decoded using a Conditional Access Module (CAM) and a card provided by your digital TV operator.

A CAM module may support several digital services. Contact your digital TV operator for more information about services and terms.

Using the Common Interface Function

CAUTION: Turn off the TV before inserting the CAM module. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

Incorrect installation of the CAM module may damage both the module and the TV.

1. Following the instructions printed on the card, carefully insert the module into the Common Interface slot on the TV.
2. Insert the module all the way in.
3. Turn on the TV and wait for the function to activate. This may take a few minutes.

Note: Do not remove the CAM module from the slot while the TV is in operation. Removing the module will disable digital services.

Accessing Common Interface Services

After installing the CAM module, press «» on the remote control, select **Settings** → **Channels & Inputs** → **Channel** → **Common Interface**, and press «**OK**» to enter. This menu option is only available if the CAM module is correctly inserted and activated. Apps and content are provided by your digital TV operator.

Note: This function is only available for digital broadcast channels.

Accessibility

Google TV actively develops accessibility features for people with disabilities, such as a screen reader, text enlargement, and subtitle support with style customization.

Using Subtitles

You can enable subtitles for each TV channel. Subtitles are broadcast either as Teletext or in DVB-T/DVB-T2/DVB-C/DVB-S/DVB-S2 digital broadcast format. With digital broadcasting, you also have the option to select your preferred subtitle language.

Note: Some options are only available when subtitles are enabled.

Turning Subtitles On/Off

1. Select «» on the remote control, select **TV Settings** → **Advanced Settings** → **Subtitles**, and press «**OK**».
2. Select the **Subtitles** option and press «**OK**» to toggle it on or off.
3. Press the «» button to return to the previous menu.

Enabling Subtitle Language Selection on Digital TV Channels

1. Press «» on the remote control, select **TV Settings** → **Advanced Settings** → **Subtitles** → **1st Digital Subtitle Language**, and press the **Right** button.
2. Press «**Up/Down**» to select the subtitle language, and press «**OK**» to confirm.
3. Press «**Up/Down**» to select the second subtitle language, and press «**OK**» to confirm.
4. Press «» to return to the previous menu.

Selecting Subtitle Type on Digital TV Channels

1. Press «**≡**» on the remote control, select **TV Settings → Advanced Settings → Subtitles → Subtitle Type**, and press «**OK**».
2. Press «**Up/Down**» to select the subtitle type, and press «**OK**» to confirm. You can select the **Hard of Hearing** option to display subtitles in the selected language for viewers with hearing impairments.
3. Press «**←**» to return to the previous menu.

Using Teletext

Selecting the display language for the decoding page:

1. Press «**≡**» on the remote control, select **TV Settings → Advanced Settings → Teletext → Decoding Page Language**, and press «**OK**».
2. Press «**Up/Down**», to select the language in which the teletext will be displayed, and press «**OK**» to confirm.
3. Press the «**←**» button to return to the previous menu.

Digital Teletext Language

Depending on the broadcaster, digital TV channels may offer several Teletext pages in different languages. This function lets you select a language from the list as the primary language, which is then linked to different Teletext start pages.

1. Press «**≡**» on the remote control, select **TV Settings → Advanced Settings → Teletext → Digital Teletext Language**, and press «**OK**».
2. Press «**Up/Down**», to select the language, and press «**OK**» to confirm.
3. Press the «**←**» button to return to the previous menu.

Screen Reader

Enables voice narration of the interface. Activate it under **Settings → Accessibility → TalkBack** (screen reader).

Text Enlargement

Increase the font size under **Settings → Accessibility → Font Size**.

Audio Description

Enable audio description for movies and shows (if supported by the content) in **Settings → Accessibility → Audio Description**.

Note: Some functions can also be enabled using the corresponding buttons on the remote control (see the «Remote Control» section).

Using Quick Start

Enabling this feature allows the TV to exit standby mode faster, but it also increases power consumption in standby mode.

1. Press «» the remote control, select **Settings → System → Power and Energy → Quick Start**, and press the **Right** button.
2. Select the **Quick Start** option and press «**OK**» to toggle it on or off.
3. Press «» to return to the previous menu.

Wake on LAN

This feature allows you to turn on the TV from standby mode over your home network. To use this feature, make sure that:

1. Your TV is connected to your home network.
2. The device you will use to turn on the TV is connected to the same home network.
3. An app that supports Wake on LAN is installed on that device.
4. Network standby is enabled in the **Network & Internet** menu.
5. In Google TV mode, press «» on the remote control, select **Settings → Network & Internet → Network Standby**, and press «**OK**» to enable it.

While the TV is in standby mode, you can use the app to remotely wake it from standby.

Notes

- This feature is only available in Google TV mode.
- This feature is not available on all models.
- This feature will be disabled if you press and hold the «» button on the remote control for a few seconds and confirm turning off the TV.
- Before using Wake on LAN, make sure **Quick Start** is enabled.

External Device Control (CEC)

Use this feature to detect and control devices that support the CEC protocol.

Enabling or Disabling CEC

1. Press «» on the remote control, select **Settings → Channels & Inputs → Inputs → External Device Control**, and press the **Right** button.
2. Select the **HDMI Control** option and press «**OK**» to toggle it on or off.
3. Press «» to return to the previous menu.

Syncing TV Power-On with Other Devices

This setting allows the TV to turn on automatically when a connected CEC device (such as a DVD player or game console) is turned on. Press «**OK**» to enable this feature.

Device Standby Sync

Allows all CEC devices to automatically enter standby mode when the TV is turned off using the remote control. Press «**OK**» to enable this feature.

Note: CEC functions depend on the connected devices, and some devices may not work correctly when connected to this TV. For more information, refer to the connected device's user manual.

Electronic Program Guide (EPG)

EPG is an on-screen guide that displays scheduled digital TV programs. You can navigate, select, and preview programs.

1. Press «» on the remote control.

In the menu that appears, you can view information about the current or next program. Navigate between different programs using the «**Up/Down/Left/Right**» buttons on the remote control.

2. To view the EPG, use the corresponding buttons, which are indicated on the left side of the screen.

- **Filter**

Navigate using the «**Up/Down**» buttons on the remote control.

Press «**OK**» to confirm your selection.

- **Schedule**

Press «**OK**», then select **Reminder** or **Scheduled Recording** to set the channel, date, and reminder time. Follow the on-screen prompts to complete the settings.

3. Press «» to return to the previous menu.

Shortcut Button

You can set up quick access to any app or setting using the «» button.

Live TV

Live TV is a function for watching live over-the-air broadcasts. It is activated by pressing the «**Live TV**» button on the remote control and lets you jump straight to the current program from an antenna, cable, or satellite source.

User Profile Support

Google TV allows you to create multiple user profiles for personalized content. Each profile is linked to a Google Account and stores individual preferences, watchlists, and viewing history.

Creating a Profile

1. Press the **Google Assistant** button on the remote control, or select the profile icon in the top-right corner of the home screen.
2. Select Add Profile and sign in to a Google Account.
3. Set up profile details, such as the name and avatar.

Creating a Child Profile

In the **Add Profile** menu, select **Create Child Profile**.

1. Set age restrictions and select allowed apps (such as YouTube Kids).
2. Set up a PIN for parental controls via **Settings** → **Accounts & Sign-in** → **Parental Controls**.

Switching Profiles

On the home screen, select the profile icon and choose the desired profile.

Notes

- An internet connection is recommended for optimal performance.
- Some apps may not support multi-user mode.

Controlling Smart Home Devices via Google TV

A TV running Google TV can serve as a hub for controlling smart home devices that support Google Home.

Setting Up Google Home

1. Make sure the TV is connected to Wi-Fi and linked to your Google Account.
2. Open the Google Home app on your smartphone, or use Google Assistant on the TV.
3. Add smart home devices (lights, outlets, cameras, etc.) via **Settings → Devices & Services → Add Device**.

Controlling Devices

- Use voice commands via **Google Assistant**, such as: «Turn on the living room lights» or «Show the camera on screen.»
- Control devices through the Google TV interface, in the **Devices** section.

Game Mode

1. Connect the console to an HDMI port that supports HDMI 2.1 (see port specifications in the «Specifications» section).
2. Enable Game Mode: **Settings** → **Picture** → **Advanced Settings** → **Game** → **Game Mode**.
3. To set up the game menu, assign the **Game Optimizer** function to the «» shortcut button and press it.

Note: VRR and 4K@120Hz require an Ultra High Speed HDMI cable and a compatible game console.

Cloud Gaming Services

- Install apps such as **GeForce Now** or **Xbox Cloud Gaming** from the Google Play Store.
- Connect a compatible gamepad via Bluetooth for game streaming.

Additional Game Mode Settings

- **ALLM** — Auto Low Latency Mode. The TV can automatically enable or disable low-latency game mode depending on the signal content. Typically used with game consoles.
- **Low Latency** — Low-latency game mode.
- **MEMC** — Motion Estimation and Motion Compensation in game mode, balancing low display latency with image smoothness.
- **DLG** — Improves image smoothness, especially with fast-moving content such as video games or video playback.
- **VRR** — Variable Refresh Rate. Dynamically syncs the refresh rate with the frame rate of the graphics source.
- **Crosshair** — Turns the crosshair overlay on or off.
- **Crosshair Type** — Selects the crosshair style.
- **FPS** — Frame rate.
- **Contrast Type** — Preset picture contrast modes.
- **Backlight** — Screen brightness.
- **Low Blue Light** — Electronic device screens emit blue light, which can cause eye strain and, over time, contribute to vision problems.
- **Display Mode** — Selects the image aspect ratio.
- **Sharpness** — Image sharpness.

Settings

Network & Internet

1. Use the navigation buttons to move between options.
2. Press «OK» to confirm your network selection.

About

This menu displays information about the device.

Date & Time

In this menu, you can set the time manually or automatically, select the time zone, and choose the time format.

Power

Power Modes

Configures the device's power consumption in standby mode. Includes the following options:

- **Low Power** — Disables the internet connection when the TV is not in use. Important updates and features remain available.
- **Optimized Power** — When the TV is not in use, it enters standby mode. It remains connected to the internet and can be woken remotely via **Google Assistant** or **Google Cast**.
- **High Power** — The device stays online at all times, with network features available even when the TV is not in use. In addition to the other functions, this mode enables automation setup and integration with the **Google Home** app.

Sleep Timer

Configures automatic shutdown of the device.

- **On Inactivity** — Automatically turns off the TV if it is not used for a certain period.
- **While Watching** — Automatically turns off the TV during use.

Simulates an HDR picture. The device analyzes the contrast and brightness of the SDR signal and expands the range to approximate HDR quality.

Adaptive Brightness Control

Analyzes contrast based on the content histogram to produce deeper blacks and brighter whites.

Local Contrast Control

Divides each frame into small zones and automatically adjusts contrast for each zone.

DI Film Mode

A function for 3:2 or 2:2 cadence video content at 24 frames per second that eliminates artifacts such as interlacing or judder. Set **DI Film Mode** to «Auto» or turn it off by selecting «Off». This item is unavailable when Game Mode or PC Mode is enabled.

Cool Blue Stretch

Shifts the white balance at mid-to-high gray levels toward a cooler color temperature.

MEMC (Motion Estimation Motion Compensation)

Optimizes video to improve picture quality and clarity. Set to «Low,» «Medium,» or «High» to enable MEMC.

HDMI RGB Range

Configures the color range for HDMI. Limited (16–235) or Full (0–255). Set your preferred HDMI RGB range. This item is unavailable unless HDMI is selected as the input source.

Low Blue Light

Electronic device screens emit blue light, which can cause eye strain and, over time, contribute to vision problems.

Color Tuning

Saturation, hue, and brightness can be adjusted for red, green, blue, cyan, magenta, yellow, and skin tone, for a more vivid or natural picture.

11-Point White Balance

The white balance function calibrates the TV's color temperature across grayscale levels. Grayscale uniformity can be improved visually or through measurement.

Reset

Resets all picture settings to factory defaults.

Offset

Offsets the RGB color channels.

Sound

Sound style

Preset sound modes for different use cases.

Balance / Bass / Treble

Use the navigation buttons to select and adjust the parameter.

Adds a surround sound effect.

Adjusts individual frequency bands.

Delays audio output through the speakers.

Auto Volume Control

Automatically adjusts the volume level.
Press «OK» to turn the function on or off.

Downmix

Dialogue Enhancement

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter the submenu.

eARC

Transmits audio via HDMI from the TV to an audio device.

Digital Output

Selects the audio output device.

SPDIF Delay

Delays audio output through the optical/coaxial connector.

Downmix Mode

Selects the number of audio output channels.

Dolby Audio Processing

Processes audio using Dolby technologies.

Reset to Default Settings

Press to reset settings to factory defaults.

Storage

Internal Shared Storage

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter the submenu.

Removable Media

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter the submenu.

Demo Mode

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter activate.

Google Assistant

In this menu, you can configure voice control, view permissions, enable/disable personal results, set an app filter, and enable SafeSearch.

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter activate.

Location

Geolocation

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter activate.

Always Scan for Networks

1. Press the navigation button to select an option.
2. Press «OK» to enter activate.

Bluetooth

1. Press and hold «←» and tilt the volume rocker to the «—» position.
2. When the indicator lights up, release the buttons.
3. Press the «←» button to exit.

Data Security

- Manage app permissions in **Settings → Apps → App Permissions**.
- Use a strong password for your Google Account and enable two-factor authentication.
- To protect children, set up parental controls in **Settings → Accounts & Sign-in → Parental Controls**.

Firmware Update

Google TV Update

- The TV automatically checks for updates when connected to the internet.
- To check manually: go to **Settings → System → About → System Update**. Press **Check for Updates**.
- Make sure the TV is connected to a stable Wi-Fi or Ethernet network.

Display Information

An LCD TV is a high-tech product. The TV screen contains several million thin-film transistors, which provide a perfect and vivid picture. Occasionally, a few inactive pixels may appear on the TV screen in the form of fixed blue, green, red, black, or white dots. Please note that this does not affect the TV's performance and is not considered a defect. All LCD panels comply with Class II according to ISO 13406-2.

The ISO 13406-2 standard distinguishes 4 types of defective pixels

- **Type 1** — constantly lit pixels (white).
- **Type 2** — constantly unlit pixels (black).
- **Type 3** — pixels with other defects, including sub-pixel and RGB cell defects that make up the pixel. This means constantly lit red, green, and blue pixels.
- **Cluster** (group of defective pixels) — several defective pixels within a 5 × 5 pixel square.

Class	Type 1	Type 2	Type 3	Number of clusters containing more than 1 defect of type 1 or 2	Number of clusters containing more than 1 defect of type 3

The ISO 13406-2 standard defines 4 classes of LCD quality depending on the number of defective pixels. Most LCD TVs and displays from leading global manufacturers comply with the Class II limits.

Rules and Conditions for Installation, Storage, Transportation, Sale (Distribution), and Disposal
